Mick - striking a food program committee with schools Market coupons for lower income families Food bank has refrigeration now, more fruits and veg David Everest is opening Cooperative bakery this year in New Denver March 2^{nd} seed swap etc in Silverton Memorial hall 10-1 Abra suggests the Environmental Farm Plan for fencing

Paris - RDCK

Applying for a grant from CBT if anyone else wants on board

Kim – Nelson community food center instead of food cupboard
Adding educational food skills program and afterschool program
Renovation to the basement of the united church which is their full time space
Upgrading the kitchen for large community dinners

The garden at Ward St. 9000 sq ft, to give out and use at the food skills program. Property sold, they need new garden space. Kim is stepping down as garden coordinator, they will need a new one. (Abra asks for Kim to share posting)

Kootenay Boundary food producers coop – wrapping up sales, will not be operational this year. When there are lots of volunteers, success moving food from small farms to small stores. Not profitable, members did not want to increase to commercial. Hiatus, will reevaluate next year.

Shauna – Kootenay food is applying for funding from CBT Homestead gleaning and rescuing food, harvesting only what can be put away Vehicle to tow mobile classroom, we have about 25 people, teach 100 – 150 students food safety, and how to put up food etc implementing more indigenous traditions in regards to food. Sausage making with kids from 5 years old up to adult Press fest 4 years old, expand to more communities further away Helping young agrarians, still looking for farmers to show and tell

Tara – Interior health, food literacy - looking at the cost of eating in BC. Looking at it as income based problem. Getting ready to pilot new school program, hands on food activities. Some in this area, school district 20, every school has a breakfast program.

Elizabeth – Fields forward in Creston valley mobile press, applying for grant with CBT



Juice - hoping to capture some of the thousands of pounds of cherries that don't meet the grade. Could box the juice and give to the food bank Trying to address food security

Ramona – glad to be joined by Paul and alternate Lea Main? Polling done shows that people are concerned by land use and changing environment Grizzly bear wiped out flocks of chickens in our local community, 500 birds over a 4 km stretch.

Paul – Edgewood finished a community kitchen
Discussions with community services to see if the arrow lakes food bank can be upgraded

Nicole – East shore will have 3 food markets this year.

Crawford Bay school has a farm to food program, would like to develop a curriculum so that students can be in the garden

Crawford bay hall has just purchased the land they are on, and will be renovating the kitchen Plan for the future is to develop some kind of food bank, 4 people working on it

Haley – February 2 in the Slocan valley farm business planning, social in the evening. Great event on Monday with over 40 people. Business mentorship program moving forward in the spring Would love to feature farmers and food processors on the blog

Abra revamp of the website in May.

Paris - there is a program thru RDCK a la carte energy efficiency
